## Past Perfect Continuous Tense Chapter 8



#### Past Perfect Continuous Tense

The Past Perfect Continuous (Progressive) is very similar to the Past Perfect. However, while using this tense, we focus on the duration of an activity rather than the result of it. The past perfect continuous is used to express how long something had been going on before something important happened in the past.

# Something that had been happening before something else took place

- I had been working for three hours when you arrived.
- Susan had been thinking about the idea for a while when he made the suggestion.

# Something that had been happening over a period of time in the past up until another point in the of past

- I had been playing tennis for two hours when I sprained my ankle.
- Jane had been studying for two years when he was drafted into the army

# Something that had been happening in preparation for something else

- I had been practicing for three days and was ready for the concert.
- Tom had been studying hard and felt good about the test he was about to take.

### **Common time expressions**

before, when

#### Pattern Of Positive sentences

- Subject + Auxiliary verb + Verb in ing
- Example :
  - I had been running for an hour when it started raining.
  - Mary said she **had** never **been swimming** so much in one day.

#### **Pattern Of Interrogative Sentences**

Auxiliary verb + S + Auxiliary verb + Verb in ing

Example:

- For how many hours had Fred been painting the house when the ladder fell?
- How long had the player been playing before he scored?

#### **Pattern Of Negative Sentences**

- S + Auxiliary verb + not + Auxiliary verb + Verb in ing
  - Example:
- He said he wasn't tired because he hadn't been preparing his car.
- If it hadn't been raining, we would have played football.

#### **Practice!**
